### 1. Getting ready

#### At least 6 weeks before arrival:

- □ Complete the **Medical/Consent Form** <u>www.discoverysummer.co.uk/medicalform</u> (see section 4)
- □ Complete the **Travel Form** <u>www.discoverysummer.co.uk/travelform</u> (see section 5)
- □ If necessary, translate any medical letters/instructions into English (see section 4)
- □ If necessary, **at least 3 days** before travel, apply for an **ETA Visa** <u>https://www.gov.uk/guidance/apply-for-an-electronic-travel-authorisation-eta</u>
- □ Read through this document carefully



### 2. Packing list

#### OTHER

- Bath towel
- Hairbrush + hairdryer
- UK Adapter for electrical appliances (3 pin, 220 volt, RoHS Compliant)
- □ Mobile phone + charger
- Lockable suitcase
- □ Small backpack for excursions
- Medication if necessary (see section below)
- □ Glasses/contact lenses + cleaning equipment

### What NOT to bring

- Unnecessary valuables (expensive watches/jewellery). Hand in any valuables to our Course Office. They are not covered under our Medical and Travel Insurance policy
- Any clothes that are delicate and unsuitable for a school laundry
- Bedlinen
- School books, stationery, pens, pencils etc. All materials are provided by us
- Nuts or any food containing nuts (e.g. peanut butter, Nutella, chocolates containing nuts)

### 3. Pocket money

- Please bring a **pre-paid card or debit/credit card** as many shops, cafes and tourist destinations do **not** take cash
- We recommend **£60 cash per week** (£5, £10, £20 notes) for gifts, snacks etc
- Bring current bank notes <u>https://www.bankofengland.co.uk/banknotes/current-banknotes</u>



- Cash may be withdrawn from cash machines (ATMs) in the centre of Winchester
- The administrator will give you some pocket-money before excursions
- If your parents want to transfer pocket money during the course, we charge **a fee of £25**.

# 4. Health/Medication

- Your parents must complete our **Medical + Consent Form** <u>www.discoverysummer.co.uk/medicalform</u> at least 6 weeks before arrival
- To discuss a medical, welfare or behavioural issue, contact Mary Shipley at Head Office +44 20 7937

- On arrival, please hand in all medication (except for auto injectors/Epipens or inhalers which you need to keep with you) to the course office
- <u>Medicine must be in the original box or bottle clearly labelled with (pharmacy or doctor's)</u> <u>instructions translated into English, in date.</u> If you need the medicine, our staff will administer it

#### If you're feeling ill:

- The House Parent will look after you
- Our appointed First Aiders will administer common, non-prescribed medication such as paracetamol and throat lozenges as necessary unless your parents advise us not to do so
- We cannot give or allow you to take any other medication unless it has been prescribed by a doctor
- If necessary, we'll take you to the **local medical practice or Accident and Emergency department**. In the UK NHS emergency treatment is free but the medical practice/hospital may charge you for a consultation with a doctor or nurse
- In case of illness or injury we will follow the advice of the attending medical consultant/surgeon unless your parents ask us not to
- If you need to see a dentist, we will take you. You may need to pay for this
- Medical expenses may be claimed under **Medical and Travel Insurance Policy** (see separate document), provided they are not for a pre-existing condition.



- We offer free transfers for flights scheduled to arrive at/depart from London Heathrow, and London Gatwick between 09:00h and 16:00h on the published arrival/departure days
- Eurostar St Pancras free transfers at specific times, please contact us for details
- If you're arriving at another airport, outside published times or on a different day we'll arrange a private transfer at extra cost
- Please complete the **Travel Form** *at least* 6 *weeks* before the start of the course even if you are coming direct to the school <u>www.discoverysummer.co.uk/travelform</u>

### ON ARRIVAL IN THE UK

- When you arrive at the airport you'll go through passport control, collect your luggage and walk through customs. Our airport representatives/drivers will be in the arrivals hall holding a Discovery Summer sign with your name on it
- We are responsible for you from the time you come through customs on arrival to the time you go through to security on departure
- We'll take you to the course centre by coach or taxi. You normally leave the airport within 2 hours but there may be a delay if other students' flights are delayed

**By rail:** Direct trains from London Waterloo to Winchester takes just under 1 hour. A taxi from the station takes 5 minutes

# 7. What happens on arrival



- Our staff and English Student Hosts will welcome you
- You'll be registered in the course office and hand in your money, credit/debit card, passport, airline forms and medication for safekeeping
- We'll give you a lanyard and ID card to wear at all times
- You'll then join in activities and meet new friends
- You'll have a written and oral English placement test and be placed into the correct English class (this may happen the following day).



# 8. Keeping you safe and happy

The following staff will look after you:

- The **Course Director** is in charge of the course
- The **Administrator** helps the Course Director and is in the course office to answer questions
- The **House Parent** is like the 'mum' or 'dad' who makes sure you are happy and settled in, and looks after you if you're ill.

We have responsibility to **safeguard** you which means:

- Making sure you have the basic things you need (food, accommodation etc)
- Looking after you if you're ill
- Making sure all the activities you do are safe and appropriate
- Making sure all the adults working on the course are safe and know how to look after you
- Educating you about safety in real life and online
- Making sure other children don't bully or abuse you
- Helping you if you have any problems.

# 9. Laundry

- Personal laundry and bed linen is washed once a week
- All clothes must be **machine-washable**
- Please clearly name all your clothes (name tags or written on in permanent pen)



### 10. Meals

- We provide 3 meals a day and evening snack
- Meals are taken in the 14<sup>th</sup> century college hall and on excursions we'll give you a packed lunch
- We provide a healthy range of food to suit international students
- Please tell us **at least 6 weeks** before the start of the course if you have any allergies or other dietary requirements (e.g. vegetarian)
- Unfortunately, we cannot provide Halal meat but we always provide a vegetarian alternative
- If you can't find any food you like, the House Parent will help you. If you have a problem with the food, please speak to the Course Director



# 11. Religious/ cultural observance

- We have a quiet room where you can go to pray
- If you'd like to visit a place of worship e.g. a church/mosque, please speak to the course office

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### 12. Accommodation

- 2-3 houses, average 40 students per house
- Bedrooms range between 1-6 beds
- Showers: ratio approximately 1:6
- Boys and girls sleep in separate houses/areas and are not allowed to visit each other's rooms
- Students from other countries will be sharing your room/on your corridor so you can make friends and speak in English.

14. Rules and Behaviour Policy	
DO	DON'T
<ul> <li>Speak English</li> <li>Listen to staff and follow their instructions</li> <li>Be on time (always)</li> <li>Be kind, friendly to others</li> <li>Attend and join in all lessons and activities</li> <li>Look after your belongings and the school</li> <li>Keep your room tidy and make your bed</li> <li>Follow the school guidelines relating to the use of phones, cameras and games consoles. These must not be used during classes, meals or activities</li> <li>Stay in your bedroom after bedtime and remain quiet</li> <li>Give all your money, medication and valuables to the course office to look after</li> <li>Have your <i>Discovery ID</i> card with you at all times</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Leave the school unless with staff/parent/guardian</li> <li>Buy or consume alcohol, take drugs or smoke (cigarettes or e-cigarettes)</li> <li>Bring unnecessary valuables</li> <li>Bring or buy knives, weapons or toy guns</li> <li>Swear, fight, bully or use inappropriate language or gestures</li> <li>Drop litter, or chew gum</li> <li>Access or share illegal/inappropriate online material</li> <li>Cause damage (e.g. to school property, equipment or other student's property). Any damage must be paid for</li> <li>Steal or shoplift</li> <li>Swim without a lifeguard being present</li> <li>Use fire escapes unless for emergency exit</li> </ul>

Go into boy's accommodation if you are a girl or go into girl's accommodation if you are a boy without agreement of the Course Director.

Good behaviour is encouraged and rewarded. If rules are broken, you will be given a warning and we will discuss how you should improve your behaviour. We may contact your parents and you may miss an activity or excursion.

#### **VERY IMPORTANT**

The safety and well-being of our students is our primary concern. Students who break British law, do not obey the course rules, who repeatedly misbehave, do not follow the instructions of the course staff or otherwise disrupt or adversely affect the smooth running of the course will be asked to leave the course **immediately** at their own expense and without refund of fees.



# 15. Mobile phone policy

The Discovery Summer experience is about making new friends and communicating in English. This is why we limit the amount of time you can spend on your mobile phone/devices.

- You can use your phone to contact your parents after lunch (13:30-14:00) or after evening activities (21:00 – 22:00)
- You **can't** use your phone in lessons, activities, meetings, mealtimes or after lights out
- If you don't follow this rule, we'll store your phone in the course office
- We arrange **No Phone Days** when you can win points by not using your phone all day
- Free Wifi and all UK mobile networks available on campus
- You can buy a UK SIM cards (£5) and top-up credit from the course office.

### **17. Departures**

The day before you leave:

- Your teacher will give you your certificate, academic report and folder
- You'll have time to pack and your House Parent will help you check your room
- The Course Director will explain what time you'll be taken to the airport.

#### On departure we'll give you your:

- Passport
- Travel Documents
- Remaining pocket money
- Bank/Credit card
- Any valuables you handed in
- Your medication

We'll arrange your departure coach/taxi. At the airport we'll help you with check-in/baggage drop and take you to security. If your parents have booked the 'Unaccompanied Minor' service with the airline, we'll hand you over to the airline after check-in.

#### Leaving direct from Winchester

If your parents are collecting you, come to the course office before **12 noon**. If they need to come at another time, please contact the course office to arrange it.

If you're going to leave the course centre with another adult for a short visit or on departure, your parents **must** give permission by completing the <u>Exeat Form</u> in advance.
